



The Cape Fear Center for Inquiry continues to excel in academic progress!

The Cape Fear Center for Inquiry (CFCI) successfully achieved Annual Yearly Progress (AYP) meeting 13 of 13 federal requirements. This is the third year in a row the school has met all federal goals. The school achieved a 92% performance composite for state accountability testing granting them the status of Honor School of Excellence which is the highest achievement status offered in the state. *The results remain preliminary pending state board approval at the August 4, 2011 State Board of Education meeting.*

CFCI was founded in 2000 and is made up of grades K-8 with two classes per grade level. Class sizes range from 20-24 students. The school offers Spanish, Technology, Music (Band and Chorus), Art, Personal Fitness and Physical Education & Health in addition to the core subject areas. CFCI parents, students and community members are very involved in all aspects of the school which contributes to its continued success.

CFCI does not focus on “teaching the test” throughout the year, but rather on providing students with the tools they need to research, question, and discover new learning objectives. These students experience education through many field trips, speakers, inquiry projects, and multiple best practices in teaching and learning.

As the Cape Fear Center for Inquiry continues to grow academically, they have also begun the move into their own building. CFCI is now located at 2525 Wonder Way (off Wellington Ave.) in Wilmington, NC. This August teachers, parents and community members will celebrate a grand opening at a date to be announced. The community is filled with excitement and anticipation as the building project comes to a close.
